Sarah Mullkoff is the Manager of the Renewable Energy and Storage Siting Section at the Michigan Public Service Commission, where she has served as staff in various capacities for nine years. In her role, she leads the staff and consultants on all areas of technical review of applications for certain solar, battery energy storage, and wind projects that are submitted as part of Public Act 233, along with providing education and coordination with developers and local governments. At the MPSC, she previously served as a Departmental Analyst in the Resource Optimization and Certification Section, then as a Commissioner Advisor, advising on all areas of utility regulation.

Prior to the MPSC, Sarah worked as a grants manager in the state energy office within the Michigan Agency for Energy, and before state government, she worked on energy programs and policies at numerous non-for profit environmental and energy-related organizations. She was recognized in 2016 as an emerging clean energy leader through the Midwest Energy News's "40 Under 40" award. Sarah is a lifelong Michigander and mainly resides in Lansing, where she currently serves on Ingham County's Environmental Affairs Commission.

Sarah has an undergraduate degree in International Relations with a specialization in Environmental Policy from Michigan State University and a master's degree in Energy Regulation and Law from the Vermont Law and Graduate School, where her capstone research focused on grid resiliency post-natural disasters.
